Fishing is prohibited in the following locations

- Gold Coast City Marina (See Map 83)
- The marina complexes from Versace through to Gold Coast Bridge, east of the red channel markers (See Map 88)
- Bayview Harbour Marina (See Map 87)
- Swan Bay (See Map 80)
- Coombabah Lake (See Map 94)
- McCoys Creek (See Map 81)
- Sanctuary Cove Marina (See Map 84)
- Hope Island Marina (See Map 84)
- Manly Boat Harbour (See Map 76)

Speed Zones

The maximum speed limit allowed on smooth waters is 40 knots ([See Smooth Waters- Northern Bay Map](#))

6 Knot Zones ([See QLD Open Map](#))

- Inside all canal systems
- The stretch of the Nerang River from the S11 & S 12 beacons adjacent to the trawler berths located on the spit at Southport through to the Gold Coast Bridge. This zone extends across the river and prohibits any at-speed short cuts up on the inside. (See Map 88)
- The stretch of the Nerang River from the green beacon at Cronin Island through to the green beacon located on the upper-river side of the Gold Coast Council Chambers. (See Map 10)
- The stretch of the Nerang River from the yellow beacon located near Cronin Island through to the green beacon located on the upper-river side of the Gold Coast Council Chambers. (See Map 10)
- The anna branch of the Nerang River from the northern bridge at Macintosh Island around to where it rejoins the river at Budds Beach. (See Map 10)

- The stretch of the Nerang River from the Bundall Bridge through to 1100 metres upriver just past the red beacon at Broadbeach Waters. (See Map 11)
- The inside stretch of Tiger Mullet Channel (the area used for anchorage). (See Map 2)
- The northern side of Wavebreak Island (the area used for anchorage). (See Map 8)
- The stretch of the Coomera River from the red beacon closest to Santa Barbara through to Hope Harbour Marina. (See Map 5)
- The stretch of the Coomera River from the red beacon located downriver of Gold Coast City Marina through to the rail bridge upriver of the entrance to Monterey Keys. (See Map 6)
- Between both entrances of Wasp Creek (See Map 7)
- Between Harley Park and the mooring area south of the Grand Hotel. (See Map 8)
- The stretch of the south Coomera River from the northern beacon located at the entrance of Hope Harbour through to the last starboard beacon located adjacent to the western entrance to Sovereign Island. (See Map 84 & 85)
- From the entrance into Horizon Shores Marina through to the red beacon at Cabbage Tree Point. (See Map 1)
- From the northern entrance (yellow beacon) through to the southern entrance of McKenzies Channel (yellow beacon). (See Map 2)
- From the second red beacon north of Tipplers Resort through to the single green beacon south of the Gold Coast Boat Club (The Anchorage). (See Map 4)

Event Boundaries

The limits of the tournament boundaries see the tournament waters including Moreton Bay, the southern Bay Islands and the Gold Coast.

Northern Boundary

- North of the line between Comboyuro Point and the southern most tip of Bribie Island.

Eastern Boundaries

- East of the Caloundra Bar
- East of the line drawn between the southern most tip of Moreton Island and the northern tip of North Stradbroke Island.
- East of the Jumpinpin Bar.



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- East of the line drawn between the most easterly points of the northern and southern walls of the Gold Coast Seaway.

Southern Boundary

- None

Reduced Boundaries

- If a strong wind warning is declared by the Bureau of Meteorology the northern boundary will be reduced to the line that runs from Victoria Point to Potts Point on Macleay Island, to Blakesleys Anchorage on North Stradbroke Island. If this does occur the official launch site will be moved to Paradise Point.

Brisbane River Region- fishing at the Port of Brisbane [\(See Upper River Map\)](#)

The Port of Brisbane is a busy international port and a declared security area. Therefore fishing in and around port infrastructure is restricted, not only for security reasons but also for your safety.

The following rules apply if you are boating or fishing around the port:

- No fishing within 30 metres of any wharf or ship alongside a wharf.
- No fishing within 30 metres of dredgers and the associated pipelines
- No fishing under the wharves
- No fishing in, or on, the rock seawall
- No anchoring, mooring or attaching a vessel in any way to the rock seawall
- Fishing is permitted in the area directly off the rock seawall, except when a dredger is operating, when the 30-metre rule applies.
- No anchoring in shipping channels

Obey the Port Security vessel instructions

If you are fishing in the Port of Brisbane area you may see a blue Port Security vessel. The crew on this boat are part of extensive security measures around the port, and at times may come alongside or shine a light on your boat to see what you are doing. Please understand that they have to do this to do their job properly, and will at all times be courteous.



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If you are given a direction to move, please comply with this request as you have probably strayed into an unsafe or security area of the port operations.
